We hope you had a very enjoyable holiday season, have benefited from the showers of rain, and are looking forward eagerly to the Spring season and working toward having a successful year with your bees. For those who have ordered packages of bees/queen bees, or equipment, we trust you have two dates in mind: **March 25th** or **28th**, pick up any equipment you ordered, and **April 14th**, bees arrive at the Bost Farm. If you need further information regarding ordering bees or equipment, please refer to the archived November newsletter on our website.

Another date to remember is **February 10**. Applications to be considered for the Ed Wolfe-Robert Bost Memorial Scholarship should be mailed before that date to our WCABA address, 4355 CR 110, Georgetown, TX 78626. School-age boys or girls who are truly interested in learning about beekeeping and who are accepted for one of these scholarships will be notified before the **February 28th** meeting at which time they will be invited to attend the monthly meeting with a parent for interviews, and to the **March 27th** meeting to receive the necessary beekeeping equipment. Mentors will assist the awarded recipients in constructing their hives that evening. They will then take their hives home, paint them and have them ready to receive their bees on April 14. The parents and youths who are interested in applying should also attend all the meetings, beginning this month, to learn as much as possible before receiving their bees.

“The World of the Bee” is the topic for our Beekeeping 101 session at 7:00 PM., according to Chris Doggett who will present, and it will be about the life and times of the honey bee, the way they behave, the structure of the colony, and the various functions of the worker bees. Our members are finding these sessions to be interesting and informative.

After a break for snacks and a brief business session, Carolyn Todd of Texas Wax, Austin Chapter, will give a PowerPoint presentation and a demonstration of the ancient art of encaustic painting. Encaustic painting dates way back to prehistoric cliff and wall paintings and it has been an exciting medium for contemporary painters including Jasper Johns and Diego Rivera. Ms. Todd would appreciate the opportunity to set up some kind of network for obtaining bees wax for their Chapter’s future use.

Since the allotment of 200 packages of honey bees was not filled by the deadline of our November meeting, we are still accepting orders for bees, including adding to the number already ordered. The total to date is 174, which doesn't leave much leeway for ordering. We encourage you to send in your order if you have not yet ordered, or to send in a request to add to the number of packages you have ordered if you need more; the requests will be considered as long as possible. We want to allow members joining WCABA this month or in February to have the opportunity to start a beehive, but we also hope to fill our allotment in order to maintain the ability to order that number or more next year. The Alamo Area Beekeepers Association's recent newsletter had an article that would be of interest to our youths who are Boy Scouts as well as adults who have an interest in Boy Scout activities. It states that "the Boy Scouts of America needs data about reinstating the beekeeping merit badge. They need volunteers to be beekeeping counselors, and for beekeepers to write in to their website." Anyone can send an email supporting reinstatement of the merit badge; address it to merit.badge@scouting.org and write "Honey Bees" in the subject line.

Also supporters can go to www.beesource.com where four different documents are offered for use in support of reinstatement: (1) A general resolution that beekeeping clubs are being urged to pass and forward to the BSA; (2) A general petition form that can be circulated for collection of signatures of people who support reinstatement; (3) A petition being circulated among Scouts and Scout troops; and (4) A document as a form letter for use by beekeepers offering to serve as mentors of Scouts who will be seeking the merit badge.

The AABA newsletter also had some up-to-date information regarding Colony Collapse Disorder (CCD), the bee problem about which research scientists have been trying to identify and determine the cause for some months. Now, a team of scientists in California believe they've found the organism that's bringing the parasites into the hives: a species of parasitic fly, *Apocephalus borealis*.

Their research paper, "A New Threat to Honey Bees, the Parasitic Phorid Fly *Apocephalus borealis*", was published by the Public Library of Science's online journal PLoS One and can be accessed at www.plosone.org, according to the writer, Tom Bower.
